- actively engaged in learning with peers
- living on campus
- gaining independence through decisions made
- acquiring meaningful relationships
- hanging out with friends
- plugging in to social media and their electronics
- experiencing college to get a better job
- learning more about ideas that interest them
- working part-time to earn money for college

Inclusive postsecondary education should not "look" differently for a student who has an intellectual disability. Students enrolled in an inclusive postsecondary education programs should look like every other student with supports, if needed, naturally provided. The intentional "behind the scenes" planning that directors and coordinators realize each day is an essential ingredient to the creation and maintenance of an authentically inclusive program.
