recent conversation about what prepared him for the current job with the school district, Curtis shared that "Summer of 2019 brought me a big perspective change. Working at the Wisconsin camp via AmeriCorps, being a camp counselor reinforced my passion for helping people. I have AmeriCorps to thank, because if I did not do it, who knows where I would be, definitely not in this position that I am today." Curtis went to work for Easterseals Wisconsin camp right after the graduation. Curtis mentioned learning about AmeriCorps from Katie Sternbergh who was the experiential learning and organizational capacity coordinator at that time. Curtis mentioned his parents and their continual support and encouragement "even though they are annoying at times". When reflecting on important skills acquired in college that helped him be successful in the work environment, Curtis remembered the communication classes, the friendships he built on campus and the guidance from Integrated Studies Director, Jan Bechtel.
